TOWN OF HAMDEN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

ORDER AMENDING AND RESTATING ALLOCATIONS OF CORONAVIRUS LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS (ALSO KNOWN AS AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT FUNDS)

PRESENTED BY: Legislative Council

WHEREAS the Town received a total of \$24,140,338.00.00 in American Rescue Plan Act Funds (ARPA); and

WHEREAS, \$5,881,147.00 was previously applied as revenue for fiscal year 2021-2022 leaving a balance of \$18,259,191.00; and

WHEREAS, between October and May of 2023, the Legislative Council allocated \$17,947,500.00 for programs, projects and administrative expenses leaving a balance of \$311,691.00 which the Council now wishes to allocate to administrative, project management and compliance costs; and

WHEREAS the Legislative Council wishes to reallocate certain funds, rename and clarify certain projects and amend and restate the previously approved Orders.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1- \$311,691.00 of unallocated funding is allocated to administrative, project management and compliance costs.
- 2- The Community Campus allocation of \$10,000,000.00 approved by the Legislative Council on May 15, 2023, is reduced by \$891,741.00 so that the total for that project is \$9,108,259.00.
- 3- The project known as Community Engagement and Planning for Six Lakes is renamed Marketing Materials and Community Engagement for Six Lakes.
- 4- The project named Hamden Alliance for Trees is renamed the Town of Hamden (fiscal sponsor) on behalf of Hamden Alliance for Trees.
- 5- The project named HPYC is renamed United Way (fiscal sponsor) on behalf of HPYC.
- 6- The project known as Equitable PTA boost is renamed Equitable PTA, PTSA and PTO engagement and activities.
- 7- The Town will be responsible for providing benches and, if available, tables for the Artist project from non-ARPA funds.
- 8- The project named Artist is renamed the Town of Hamden (fiscal sponsor) on behalf of Patricia Vener-Saavedra.
- 9- The CANNH allocation is clarified: the Agreement will be "United Way of Greater New Haven on behalf of Greater New Haven Community Action Network"; and the second bucket which states \$75,000.00/yrs./3 yrs. will be to establish one full-time staff to support individuals that are currently sleeping outside to access housing and ultimately sustain that housing.
- 10- \$891,741.00 from the Community Campus reduction in #2 is reallocated to administrative, project management and compliance costs.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, the following two (1) items be added to the Order before the Council:

- 1- The project named Hamden Small Business support and grants (\$242,500.00) is reduced to \$200,000 and renamed Small Business Program. Re-allocate the \$100,000.00 to Small Business Technical Assistance Training Program.
- 2- The project named Small Business Community and non-profit (\$99,000.00) is renamed Small Business Technical Assistance and Training Program and funded at \$142,500.00.
